What is the Diploma of Communication and Media?

The Diploma of Communication and Media is designed to help you develop a broad range of skills in Communication and Media, opening up employment options across a wide range of industries. Depending on the units completed, you will develop competencies in; writing and editing, presentation, project management, small media production, interpersonal skills, the use of communication technology tools and a range of specialised technical, creative and/or conceptual skills. Those students who complete stage 1 of the course may be accredited with a Certificate IV.

Are there any entry requirements?

Yes, you must have completed the NSW HSC or equivalent and you must complete a TAFE NSW – Northern Sydney Institute (NSI) application form.

What will my commitment be?

In the full time course you will need to attend an average of 20 hours per week for one year. In the part time evening course you will need to attend an average of eight hours per week for two years (available at North Sydney College only)

How much will it cost me?

What can I do after completing the Diploma?

This course will prepare you for work as an arts officer, public relations officer, events facilitator, community development office, professional technical communicator or small media information officer. This course will also help you meet entry requirements for TAFE and university courses in Communication and Media. The degree of advanced standing you gain will depend on the electives studied in the diploma.

What financial support is available?

If you receive a Centrelink benefit, you may be exempt from the TAFE NSW fee. Please check with Student Services at your local college.
